REQUIREMENT OF DGCA ISSUED MEDICAL ASSESSMENT WHILE FLYING

A valid Medical Assessment is required by all aircrew while undertaking exercising the Privileges of his Licence. It has been observed that some aircrew continue to fly with a CA 35 for long duration without obtaining a Medical Assessment. In order to streamline the system of Medical Assessment issuance the following procedure is to be followed in the future:-

- a. The pilot can fly with the CA35 for a maximum period of 03 months. Beyond 03 months the approval of DGCA must be sought.
- b. The aircrew must seek a Medical Assessment from DGCA Medical Directorate if no assessment is received within 2 ½ months of the Medical.
- c. All DGCA Class 1 & 2 Medical Examiner / Examination Center are to check the last issued Final DGCA Medical Assessment prior to conducting the Renewal / Re-initial / Class 1 Initial / Post TU / Special Medical Examination. No Medical Examination is to be done without a Valid Medical Assessment, issued by DGCA HQs.

This provision becomes effective from 03rd December 2019.
